



Navigating the Seas of Change: 2015 Initiatives

n 2015, Sansum Clinic continued to respond to the impacts of the Affordable Care Act that took effect in 2014, most notable of which was an influx of new patients into our system. Along with the entire healthcare community, we also continued to face large scale changes in the way we report on the care we deliver and the way we are reimbursed for our services. Medicare is moving from a pay-for-volume model of care, based on the number of medical services provided, to a pay-for-value model, which considers the results of the services provided in exchange for the costs incurred. This is a revolutionary change that will ultimately result in greater accountability, affordability and quality in our healthcare system and one that requires an inordinate amount of planning and preparation.

In 2015, we broke ground on our new **\$68 million regional cancer center** in the heart of Santa Barbara that will save and enhance the lives of those diagnosed with cancer in our community. Our beloved friend and philanthropist Lady Leslie Ridley-Tree kicked off our fundraising efforts with a generous gift of \$10.7 million.

We also began the highly anticipated renovation of our multi-specialty clinic at 215 Pesetas Lane, which includes an **expansion of our Primary Care and Urgent Care services** to enable us to better serve our patients by providing more timely access to care, in a convenient and welcoming environment.

In 2015 we expanded our capabilities in Ophthalmology to include the **Femtosecond laser** to provide unparalleled safety and precision in cataract surgery; and we advanced our surgical expertise with the addition of the **Faxitron**, a new

technology that allows for more efficient and precise breast cancer surgery. Both of these innovative systems are located at the Foothill Surgery Center at Sansum Clinic in the Elings Pavilion.

Sansum Clinic continues to lead the way in preventive health services. We expanded our capabilities in 2015 with **lung cancer screening**, **3-D mammography**, and by growing our team of **genetic counselors**. We also spearheaded the **Strive for 95** campaign, a grassroots communications effort to educate patients about the importance of rebuilding our community's immunity rates to at least 95%.

We have a long history of providing high-quality care in a very efficient manner. We received recognition from the Integrated Healthcare Association (IHA) that puts us in a class with some of the most well-known healthcare organizations in the country by earning **4.5 out of a possible 5 stars** on the IHA Physician Group Clinical Care Report Card.

Sansum Clinic is the healthcare provider of choice for more than 129,000 patients and has been delivering excellence in medical care for 95 years. We have proudly adapted to meet the community's needs amidst our everchanging environment. We are proud to reflect on a successful year of fulfilling our mission to provide an excellent healthcare experience, recognizing our first priority is the patients we serve.



New Cancer Center of Santa Barbara -Raising Cancer Care to a New Level of Excellence

ansum Clinic, the Cancer Center of Santa Barbara and the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara are building the finest regional Cancer Center in the nation as we deliver on our mission of providing superior, personalized care to all members of our community, regardless of ability to pay.

A new \$68 million multidisciplinary Cancer Center, expected to open in late 2017, will save and enhance the lives of those diagnosed with cancer by unifying the newest technology, multiple medical departments and wellness programs into one modern facility in line with the National Cancer Institute's (NCI) recommended best practices. Located in the heart of Santa Barbara's medical village, this new 54,780-square-foot facility will be a model of coordinated cancer treatment, achieving both scientifically comprehensive and intensely personal care.

The NEW Cancer Center of Santa Barbara with Sansum Clinic will improve cancer care by delivering the following benefits:

Centralized Gateway with Enhanced Collaboration: Uniting three patient care offices on Pueblo Street will provide a single, convenient place for patients to access multi-disciplinary care. Bringing together medical professionals from multiple locations into one will enable us to provide a seamless personalized patient experience.

Latest Technology: The new Center will provide access to the latest treatment technologies, like state-of-the-art Linear Accelerators for Radiation Oncology and new capabilities in Surgical Oncology.

Scaled to Meet Growing Need for Care: The Cancer Center cares for more than 11,000 patients annually. A 35% increase is projected to occur for patients 65+ over the next decade.

Clinical Trials: We are dedicated to the thoughtful introduction of promising new treatment methods. The new Center will enable us to provide more opportunities for clinical research studies as our capacity to serve patients increases.

Designed to Attract Talent: The Center will enhance our ability to attract newly trained professionals coming out of top academic institutions like UCLA, Stanford, Harvard and National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Comprehensive Approach to Care: We will offer supportive care programs in the same location where patients see their physicians, including genetic counseling, patient navigation, nutrition services, support groups and counseling, library resources and education, social work services, financial and logistical support, and activities such as yoga, healing touch, exercise classes and painting.

Community Resource: This is a rare example of a project that benefits the entire community – our patients, their families and all physicians in this area, whether they are part of Cancer Center, Sansum Clinic or in independent medical practice.





Pesetas Lane Remodel: Expansion of Primary Care and Urgent Care

Opening our new Medical and Surgical Center on Foothill Road in 2014 created muchneeded space to expand Primary Care and Urgent Care services at our multispecialty clinic at 215 Pesetas Lane. Expansion of access is a critical priority and the remodel we kicked off in 2015 will allow us to better serve our patients by providing more timely access to care in settings that are appropriate and convenient for our residents. From a patient perspective, quality often means receiving services that meet their needs at the right time and the right place, and this expansion represents a significant milestone in working to meet this goal.

At the 215 Pesetas Lane Clinic in 2015

Urgent Care Services will relocate from the current Santa Barbara location on Hitchcock Way to the newly-improved Pesetas Lane clinic adjacent to Imaging, Laboratory, and Pharmacy – all services frequently accessed in tandem with Urgent Care. This expansion will effectively double our capacity to care for patients and will allow us to employ new patient workflows for greater efficiency and service. Most importantly, this expansion will allow us to see a greater number of patients each year for urgent medical care, keeping them out of the more costly hospital emergency room, and also providing capacity for same-day appointments.

At the same time, we are taking the opportunity to refresh the aesthetics at the Pesetas Lane clinic to create a welcoming and more comfortable environment for our patients. This facility was built in the 1960s and has remained relatively unchanged since then. In recent years we have invested in world-class physicians, advanced technology, and compassionate staff; however, the quality of the Pesetas facility has not kept pace with the quality of care we deliver. We are using the same design elements as the Foothill buildings in an effort to continue to unify the look and feel of our clinics. Introducing modern facilities that match the caliber of our physicians and staff will have a positive impact on our patients' experience at Sansum Clinic.

In addition to expanding capacity for Urgent Care and Primary Care services, the Clinic has made a dedicated effort in Disaster Preparedness for our community. As part of the expansion and remodel taking place at the Pesetas Lane Clinic, we are installing emergency power, which will enable us to serve the community even in the case of natural disaster.

The Pesetas Lane expansion is made possible largely through the generous support of our donors, many of whom are grateful patients. Work progressed throughout 2015, and is scheduled to conclude in the second half of 2016.

Expanded Pediatric Services

In 2015, we began our expansion of Pediatric Services at 51 Hitchcock Way, which will result in 44% more exam room space, capacity for two more providers, a shot/vaccination room, a reception area that is comfortable for pediatric patients and their accompanying parents and family members, and a dedicated lactation room for nursing mothers.

Foothill Medical and Surgical Center at **Elings Pavilion and Elings Eye Center**

Opened in July of 2014, the Sansum Clinic Medical and Surgical Center at 4151 Foothill Road offers two buildings with 60,000 square feet of new medical space for specialty and surgical care in modern facilities with the latest equipment and technology.

The Foothill Surgery Center, part of this new campus, was accredited by AAAHC in August 2014. 2015 marked the first full year of operation, and the center has since served more than 2,000 patients with ambulatory surgery services.

Expanded Diagnostic Imaging

Advanced Imaging has become a very important tool in the early detection of cancer. At Sansum Clinic, we are utilizing high-tech imaging capabilities with both computed tomography (CT) and mammography to effectively screen our patients to detect cancer as soon as possible. Early detection is key to the most successful treatment and outcomes.

We have expanded our Diagnostic Imaging for breast and lung cancers by now offering 3D Mammography and low-dose lung cancer screening services. In May 2015, Sansum Clinic and the Cancer Center of Santa Barbara with Sansum Clinic was designated as an American College of Radiology (ACR) Lung Cancer Screening Center offering patients an option for lung cancer screening as recommended by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force. Yearly lung cancer screening is recommended for people between the ages of 55 and 80 who have a history of heavy smoking (equivalent to smoking one pack per day for 30 years) and smoke now or have quit within the past 15 years. The program has already identified cases of lung cancer and other potentially concerning findings that require close follow-up. These cancer cases, if not detected with this screening, would have otherwise likely gone undetected until later, potentially un-treatable stages.

2,174 patients received 3D mammograms in 2015

In August, we implemented new **3D Mammography technology** with the acquisition of two Selenia Dimensions from Hologic®. The new technology provides earlier breast cancer detection, greater accuracy and decreased recall rates. Multiple studies have shown that all women, regardless of breast type or density, may benefit from 3D Mammography. 41% of all women who receive a mammogram do so with this new technology. We also have expanded clinical hours to better meet the needs of working patients, now offering appointments on Friday afternoons and Saturday mornings.

Sansum Clinic was able to invest in two 3D Mammography machines thanks to the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara and generous support from many individual donors to ensure this technology is available for our patients and the community.

Uncovering Cancer in Our Genes – Expanded Genetic Counseling Program

The **Genetic Counseling Program** at the Cancer Center of Santa Barbara expanded to three onsite genetic counselors, making it one of the largest programs in California. The Cancer Center expanded the program in response to growing demand from patients and physicians for help identifying and supporting individuals with genetic predispositions to cancer.

Approximately 5-10% of cancer patients carry in their genes an identifiable hereditary predisposition to cancer. Genetic counselors help identify which patients should be tested for one of these mutations and for which mutations they should be screened. When a mutation is found, the genetic counselors assist patients and their doctors by identifying the specific cancers to which they are susceptible and to determine the means by which these cancers might be detected at an early stage or prevented entirely. They also counsel family members who might also benefit from genetic testing.

Thanks to a grant through **Richard V. Gunner**, trustee of the Dr. Howard R. Bierman and Anthony (Andy) Granatelli Fund, the Genetic Counseling Program has expanded to support our community by identifying and supporting individuals with Lynch Syndrome, the most common hereditary colorectal cancer syndrome. Colon cancer genetic testing referrals are not as common as breast cancer referrals because many people are unaware of the option to test for *hereditary* colon cancers. This means there are people in the community who may not know they should be evaluated for hereditary colorectal cancer conditions.

The New Femtosecond Laser

A new **femtosecond laser**, in place since early 2015 at the Foothill Surgery Center at Sansum Clinic, is giving eye doctors an unparalleled level of safety and precision in cataract surgery. Femto is short for femtosecond. A femto laser has an ultra-short pulse, one-quadrillionth of a second to be exact. Unlike the traditional procedure where surgeons use a blade to access the cataract, the femto laser creates perfectly-sized incisions, cutting the cataract into small pieces so the cloudy lens can be removed more easily, and with less damage to the eye. **5**

Faxitron Revolutionizes Breast Cancer Surgery

In 2015, Sansum Clinic acquired a special X-ray apparatus called the **Faxitron** at Sansum Clinic's Foothill Surgery Center to improve both the patient and the doctor experience with breast cancer surgery.

Before the Clinic acquired this advanced technology, the breast specimen had to be taken to a different facility to be X-rayed and viewed by a radiologist. Now, with the Faxitron, surgeons have better control in the operating room and can do everything in one session. The end result is a more efficient surgical process that eliminates lengthy steps and produces more data in less time, which is critical for assessing if all the cancer has been removed. Using the Faxitron right in the operating room reduces time patients spend under general anesthesia, reduces the potential for re-excision and improves patient care. 5

Advanced Cancer Treatment Using VMAT


Monaco 5 and **Monte Carlo** technologies are an integral part of our new VMAT (Volumetric Modulated Arc Therapy) that delivers the most advanced form of radiation therapy available anywhere. Of the three main approaches to cancer treatment — surgery, chemotherapy and radiation — radiation therapy is used in more than half of all cancer treatments.

Monaco 5 is a treatment planning system that allows our specialists to develop a more accurate individualized treatment plan for each patient to kill cancer cells more quickly and effectively than ever before.

Monaco 5 is controlled by Monte Carlo, the most advanced calculation engine in use anywhere in the world. Together, the system permits ultra-precise dose delivery in a shorter amount of time using VMAT.

When used together, these more precise systems can pinpoint cancer-killing energy beams more effectively than ever before while protecting healthy tissue. The system improves patient comfort and cure rates while reducing treatment times from 40-50 minutes to only 10 minutes or less using VMAT.

By continuing to invest in the latest technologies like VMAT, we are ensuring our patients have access to the best treatments available.




Walk-In Vaccination Clinic

In October 2015 we opened a walk-in vaccination clinic for routine immunizations, now available at two pharmacy locations. Vaccines offered include Influenza, Pneumococcal, Zoster and Pertussis.

Immunizations are provided by nurses and pharmacists professionally trained and certified to administer vaccines. This option is convenient for patients as no appointments are necessary and most prescription plans offered are eligible. 5


Enhancing Care with Mid-Level Providers

In 2015 we expanded our medical staff with additional **Nurse Practitioners** and **Physician Assistants** (mid-level providers). Utilizing mid-level providers for routine patient appointments allows for more timely access to care while enabling physicians to work at the maximum of their licensure, which in turn contributes to enhanced physician retention. The integration of mid-level providers is especially beneficial in specialty practices, providing a cost-effective option for routine care while allowing physicians to make the best use of their knowledge and experience. We have already seen these benefits in Endocrinology, the Anticoagulation Clinic, and Obstetrics/
Gynecology. Clinic-wide, the addition of mid-level providers has greatly enhanced both the patient and physician experience.

Improved Communication through MyChart



Sansum Clinic's innovative electronic health record system – the Wave – continues to improve the exceptional care patients have come to expect from us. The Wave provides the tools necessary for the electronic management and recording of the care patients receive at all Sansum Clinic locations.

One of the most exciting features of the Wave is our secure patient connection – MyChart – which provides patients with direct online access to key parts of their medical record. MyChart allows patients to view health information such as lab results, appointment information, medications, immunization records and details about doctor visits.

Whether patients are at work, on the road or at home, they can:

Send a non-urgent message to their medical team

Communicating with one's medical team is as simple as sending an email, but even more secure – and patients can request prescription refills online.

Check test results

Viewing test results online saves time waiting for a phone call or letter. Patients can also chart and graph results over time, engaging them in their ongoing health goals.

Request appointments online anytime

Patients may request their next appointment online or view details of past and upcoming appointments.

View medical information

Patients can review medications, immunizations, allergies, medical history, and discharge instructions.

Explore health education resources

Information about tests, medications, procedures and lifestyle choices are at patients' fingertips with our online health education resources.

Access family's records

Patients may link their children's and elderly relative's accounts* for convenient access to appointment information, immunization records, growth charts and more.

*MyChart access to the accounts of family members requires proof of legal guardianship/parental relationship. For more details, please refer to the MyChart Terms and Conditions. Due to California and Federal patient privacy laws, patients 12-17 years old will have no access to MyChart.



Initiating the Patient-Centered Medical Home Model of Primary Care

In 2015, Sansum Clinic's executive and physician leadership identified the Patient-Centered **Medical Home (PCMH)** as a model with potential for combating physician fatigue, addressing access challenges, and improving the patient experience. The PCMH model is a team-based approach to primary healthcare delivery that is intended to provide comprehensive and continuous medical care to patients with the goal of obtaining maximized health outcomes. The model is aimed at allowing better access to healthcare, increasing satisfaction with care, and improving health of patients and populations. In many cases, the medical home results in greater quality of care, cultivates more engaged patient relationships, and captures savings through expanded access and delivery options that align patient preferences with payer and provider capabilities.

Coordinating all aspects of your healthcare needs to ensure you receive the very best medical care.

Sansum Clinic will pursue designation as a Patient-Centered Medical Home to help us better service our primary care patients through five functions and attributes, including:

- 1) Comprehensive Care: Primary care providers are accountable for meeting the large majority of each patient's physical and mental health needs.
- 2) Patient-Centered Model: Relationship-based primary care that meets the individual patient and family's needs, preferences, and priorities.
- 3) Coordinated Care: Care that is coordinated across all elements of the broader healthcare system.
- **4) Accessible Services:** Enhanced access to primary care through a variety of means including expanded hours, email, and telephone communication.
- 5) Quality and Safety: A commitment to safe, high-quality care through engagement in quality improvement activities and safety monitoring.

This project began in late 2015 and will continue throughout 2016, when we will seek recognition by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA).



Successful Implementation of ICD-10 Coding System

In October 2015, Sansum Clinic and all other healthcare providers in the US implemented a new coding system – ICD-10. The transition from the previous code set (ICD-9) was part of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) eHealth Initiative to help providers deliver high-quality healthcare by simplifying the use of electronic standards and encouraging the adoption of health information technology. The eHealth Initiative addresses recent federal electronic health directives that require new paradigms for standardized data-driven operational processes to support three national healthcare goals: improved quality of care, improved health outcomes, and reduced costs without compromising quality. The transition to ICD-10 helps to achieve these goals by standardizing and facilitating the sharing of healthcare data securely and easily among providers across different sites of care.

International Classification of Diseases (ICD) is the most widely used statistical classification system for diseases in the world. ICD as we know it started with ICD-6 in 1949 and ICD codes are universally accepted, even internationally, which helps in handling epidemics and in creating efficient broad-scale systems. These codes help in developing automated systems for decision making for various treatments.

With an expansion in the number of codes from 13,000 to 68,000, the ICD-10 system was designed to support ever-changing and advancing healthcare delivery and technology. It offers far greater granularity, specificity, and the ability to expand as healthcare advances. Furthermore, ICD-10 enables the industry to more accurately measure the quality of care and to evaluate the outcome of procedures using these more precise codes.

Although the new code set brings with it many benefits, this transition required significant organizational effort to ensure technical systems and workflows were remediated and that providers and staff were trained accordingly. Nearly all billing, payment, and coverage determinations are based on ICD codes, but our robust electronic health record, the **Wave**, lessened the burden of learning and implementing this new code set. The newly-formed Project Management Office (PMO) was instrumental in orchestrating this organization-wide effort with minimal impact on patient care and our Business Office continues to work with providers to optimize use of this new code set.


Healthy People Healthy Trails is a new community program to help individuals and their families live a more active life while enjoying the outdoors.

In today's rapidly changing healthcare environment, exchange of healthcare information is one of the most significant challenges. How can we communicate correct information about the correct patient at the right time? It can be difficult. While healthcare information is by and large now stored electronically, it is often at different locations and in different systems. This is where **Health Information Exchange (HIE)** becomes vitally important. What exactly is HIE? Health Information Exchange provides the capability of securely moving health data between differing healthcare systems. HIE is not an electronic medical record. Rather, it is a portal for healthcare providers to access and query for information from many healthcare organizations and a system to send information across interfaces to deliver health information in a secure, timely, efficient, effective, and patient-centered way. Information exchange can include demographics, medications, test results, or notification that a patient has been admitted to the ER or the hospital. In compliance with HIPAA and California state regulations, the HIE enables the secure and appropriate sharing of data for treatment and payment purposes.

In Santa Barbara, we are lucky enough, both as healthcare providers and as consumers, to benefit from an HIE facilitated by Cottage Health. Known as Coastal eHealth Connection, the HIE enables the appropriate, secure, fast and efficient exchange of healthcare data within the Santa Barbara community and surrounding region. This program has been well received, and many different community decision making. The Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics and Sansum Clinic have bidirectional exchange of information including visit summary reports and results Lompoc Valley Medical Center also share data. Other organizations involved in the hospital EMS teams! The Coastal eHealth Connection Advisory Committee provides vital clinical input to the HIE project, and includes representatives from many of the involved organizations. **Dr. Laura Polito** serves as Sansum Clinic's representative







Since completing his residency in 2013, Dr. Sosnicki had been a member of the Georgetown University medical education faculty, where he taught medical students and had a full-time clinical practice.





CenCal Health Access Coordination and Expansion Program

In 2014, some of the key features of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) took effect. Medicaid expansion, one of the biggest milestones of the reform, expanded healthcare coverage to our nation's poorest in order to cover nearly half of uninsured Americans. As a result, we have seen an influx of new patients come into the system, both nationwide and into Sansum Clinic's delivery system. Although the full impact of Medicaid expansion is yet to be seen, it is clear that many patients have benefitted from these changes and that many who previously did not have access to affordable healthcare are now able to get the care they need and in the most appropriate setting.

We have experienced a notable increase in new patient visits since the implementation of the Affordable Care Act, and we have proudly adapted in an attempt to meet the community's needs amidst this changing environment. In 2015, we strengthened our partnership with CenCal Health through participation in their **Access Coordination and Expansion (ACE) Program.** This program was designed to ensure the growing Medi-Cal patient population is served with adequate access to care, health promotion and wellness activities, care coordination and disease management, and health information technology. We have remained steadfast in our commitment to meeting these needs by expanding our services, programs, and clinic sites while remaining true to our mission of providing an excellent healthcare experience, recognizing our first priority is the patients we serve. We also understand there is tremendous work still to be done in the face of an ever-growing demand for affordable quality healthcare services in our community.

Sansum Clinic and the Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics

Since 2010, Sansum Clinic has provided 3,819 **Santa Barbara Neighborhood Clinics (SBNC)** patients with 4,560 diagnostic services with a value of over \$1.8 million, at no cost. Cardiology diagnostic services include echocardiogram and cardiovascular device monitoring, and other diagnostic services include general and special radiology, MRI scans, CT scans, ultrasounds and mammograms.

"We are grateful to Sansum Clinic for the cardiology and radiology services they provide to our uninsured patients," states **Dr. Charles Fenzi**, CEO and Chief Medical Officer of SBNC. "SBNC is a critical health safety net for Santa Barbara County and we are dedicated to providing quality, affordable medical and dental care to low-income patients regardless of their ability to pay. Last year we provided medical care to 18,453 patients (63,100 patient visits). This unique collaboration with Sansum is rarely available to safety net providers elsewhere in the country."

Since the Affordable Care Act took effect we have seen a decrease in uninsured people served from 591 patients in 2014 to 418 patients in 2015, with 253 fewer diagnostic services needed.

Sansum Clinic provides these services to ensure good health is available for everyone and we will continue this partnership with Dr. Fenzi and the staff at the SBNC.











Expansion of Services

Sansum Clinic expanded services to better meet the needs of our patients in mid-Santa Barbara County.

Solvang Specialty Clinic now offers Cardiology, Nephrology, Medical Oncology, Orthopedics, Rheumatology, Nutrition and Oncology Nutrition Services.

In an effort to attract physicians to the Lompoc region, we have instituted rotating

physician coverage to ensure that the Lompoc patient population does not go underserved. Santa Barbara-based specialists are spending a greater amount of time at our **Lompoc Multi-Specialty Clinic** and specialty services now offered there include Medical Oncology, Nephrology, Cardiology, Physical Therapy, Podiatry, Rheumatology, Endocrinology and Diagnostic Imaging.





Strive for 95 Update

In the Fall of 2014, Sansum Clinic pediatricians became aware of a community health threat and decided to take action. Their efforts led to a grassroots campaign and eventually a community-wide coalition called **Strive for 95**.


The sprouting grassroots effort grew quickly. Local leaders including doctors, nurses, teachers, superintendents and public health officials gathered to discuss how best to educate our community about the importance of rebuilding our vaccination levels to at least 95%.

In April of 2015, a Strive for 95 symposium was held at the Lobero Theater to discuss the importance and safety of vaccines. Experts from Sansum Clinic, Cottage Health and the Santa Barbara County Department of Public Health answered questions from local community members. At the conclusion of the symposium, the Strive for 95 Coalition, a collaborative partnership between Sansum Clinic, Cottage Health, Santa Barbara County Department of Public Health and the Santa Barbara County Education Office, was announced.

To date, the Strive for 95 Coalition has produced an informative website **www.StriveFor95.org** as well as a comprehensive public education campaign that includes print, television, radio and digital media materials. The coalition also provides educational tools for parents, doctors, nurses and schools to help all community members learn about the importance of rebuilding our community immunization rates to at least 95%.

As the Santa Barbara community rediscovers and embraces the importance of higher vaccination rates, local pediatricians are seeing many unvaccinated and under-vaccinated children come into their offices for catch-up immunizations.

Several school districts and preschools are using Strive for 95 to start their own outreach and educational campaigns to ensure higher vaccination rates on their campuses.



Strive for 95 is a program to educate parents and the community about the importance of rebuilding our

community immunity rates to at least 95%.



Sansum Clinic Visiting Professor of Surgery

Keith D. Lillemoe, MD was the fourth nationally recognized Visiting Professor of Surgery during Surgical Academic Week, March 9-13, 2015. He followed three previous Visiting Professors: **Dr. John L. 
Dr. Lillemoe is a world renowned general surgeon who specializes in gastrointestinal and pancreaticobiliary tract surgery. He is Surgeon-in-Chief and Chief of the Department of Surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital and the W. Gerald Austen Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School. His scholarly and research interests have produced more than 350 journal publications and 115 book chapters.

Dr. Lillemoe delivered a public lecture at Sansum Clinic on his observations about how the new healthcare legislation/regulations have affected the practice of medicine and surgery on the East Coast and his prognostic projections for the West Coast.

The Visiting Professor of Surgery program provides expert educational seminars for practicing Santa Barbara surgeons and physicians. More importantly, it allows surgical residents in training at Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital the chance to interact daily with the icons, leaders and outstanding teachers of the art of surgery.



Colon Cancer Education & Prevention

Since 2000 the Cancer Center of Santa Barbara has worked to raise awareness about colon cancer and the importance of colon cancer screening for those over the age of 50. Community education and events have helped us educate our community about colon cancer prevention and the importance of early detection.

In March 2015 the Cancer Center and Cottage Health hosted an educational event called **Demystifying the Screening Colonoscopy** that included tours and cancer screenings. Attendees enjoyed lectures by Sansum Clinic Gastroenterologist **Dr. Jim Egan** and Cancer Center Oncology Dietician **Sarah Washburn**, MS, RD, CSO on the colon cancer screening process and the seven ways to help prevent colon cancer. Attendees were given take-home Fecal Immunochemical Tests at no charge. Patients with positive test results were referred for colonoscopies. In May, Sansum Clinic, the RoKe Foundation and the Cancer Foundation of Santa Barbara, in partnership with UCSB Arts and Lectures and community partner, the Orfalea Foundation, presented an evening with New York Times best-selling author Michael Pollan at the Granada Theatre. The event featured a conversation with Mr. Pollan, Dr. Kurt Ransohoff, and Dr. Fred Kass, Cancer Center Wellness Medical Director. A Q&A session and book signing followed the event.



The Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence is used for programs that assist Sansum Clinic in the recruitment and retention of physicians, including the Physician Housing Program and the Facility Improvement Program. It is also used for other endeavors which are deemed to ensure medical excellence for our patients.

Sansum Clinic's Board of Trustees established the Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence in 2012 as a tribute to the late **Jon Lovelace** and the **Lovelace Family** for their visionary support of Sansum Clinic.

In addition to the Lovelace Family we have also received support from a number of other community contributors, including our Trustees, who have embraced the vision of the Lovelace Family in supporting Sansum Clinic.

Physician Housing Program

The very generous financial support of the Lovelace Family has been instrumental in the recruitment and retention of outstanding new physicians to Santa Barbara since April 2006 through our innovative **Physician Housing Program**. This program assists new physicians with the purchase of homes which they would otherwise find unaffordable in our high-priced real estate market through shared-appreciation home loans. Sansum Clinic has used this special program to attract 20 highly skilled physicians in a broad range of specialties and practice areas.

Last year physicians who used those loans saw **24,987** unique patients at **47,554** patient visits in Cardiology, Gastroenterology, Infectious Disease, Internal Medicine, Neurology, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Pulmonary/Critical Care and Rheumatology.

The program has been designed to be a revolving fund, whereby the proceeds from future home sales will be used to repay outstanding loans and flow back into the program, where they can be used again to help future physicians meet their housing needs. Six physicians have paid back their loans to the Clinic.

Although the program is expected to continue in perpetuity, it is certainly possible that the local real estate market could change so dramatically at some point in the future that the Physician Housing Program is no longer deemed to be a critically necessary tool for attracting outstanding new physicians into our community. At this time that is not the case and we have recently offered shared appreciation loans to recruit six new physicians.





Facility Improvement Program


This program assists us in modernizing our facilities to enhance our patients' experience and support our ongoing efforts to attract the highest caliber physicians from around the United States. The upgrade of our multi-specialty clinic at 215 Pesetas Lane, which began in 2015 and is expected to be completed in 2016, is part of our long-range facility plan designed to better serve the needs of the community.

This upgrade allowed for enhancing our Women's Health Program with the installation of new 3-D mammography capabilities.

The newly remodeled Pesetas clinic is meeting the design standards we set at our new Foothill Medical and Surgical Center campus, and will assist us in providing greater access to care through the expansion of Primary Care and Urgent Care services.

We will double our Urgent Care capacity and employ new patient workflows for greater efficiency and enhanced customer service. In addition, this expansion will allow us the opportunity to provide a resource not previously available in our community – a medical facility capable of providing ambulatory care and triage following an environmental disaster. By equipping the new Urgent Care with dedicated back-up power, we stand prepared to partner in our community's medical response in the case of wide-spread power failure or emergency. We expect to complete the Urgent Care remodel in summer 2016.

The Lovelace Fund for Medical Excellence and the Physician Housing and Facility Improvement Programs will help provide a lasting legacy to Sansum Clinic and Santa Barbara and the more than 129,000 patients who trust us with their medical care each year. It will also enable the Clinic to continue to keep pace with the rapidly changing healthcare environment and to anticipate the community's needs.

Philanthropy at a Glance

Dr. Erno S. Daniel Legacy Award

Erno S. Daniel, MD, PhD was a renowned physician who spent his entire professional career at Sansum Clinic. He joined the Internal Medicine department in 1978 and practiced there until his sudden death on February 21, 2015.

Martha Daniel and their children Kristina, Michael, Mary and Monica were touched by the outpouring of support from family, friends, colleagues, the medical staff and patients. Knowing how much Sansum Clinic meant to Erno, it was the family's decision to request that gifts in his memory be directed to the Clinic. The family wanted something very special to commemorate Dr. Daniel's commitment, dedication, and integrity, and with the memorial funds raised the Dr. Erno S. Daniel Legacy Award was established. This award will be given annually to an employee in the Internal Medicine department at Pesetas who exemplifies compassion, dedication, and integrity.

Early in his career, Dr. Daniel pursued an interest in the developing specialty of Geriatric Medicine, and was among the first physicians in the United States to become board certified in Geriatrics. He had special interests in dementia and Alzheimer's Disease and he lectured across the country, was the author of textbook chapters, papers and a variety of educational materials on the topics. A few days before the death of former President Ronald Reagan, he received a letter from the former First Lady, Nancy Reagan, in recognition of the chapter he wrote on Alzheimer's Disease for the 2004 edition of Conn's Current Therapy. Dr. Daniel also served for a period of time as Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Southern California. In 2008, he published a book, Stealth Germs in Your Body, which received national attention.

Dr. Daniel's contributions to the medical profession were magnified by the compassion he showed his patients. He was a master diagnostician who remembered every medical and personal detail regarding his patients. He listened to their stories and his broad interests enabled him to connect with each and every patient. Many patients stated they felt as if they had lost a member of their family. One of his former patients described him as "one of the world's truly great human beings."


Dr. Daniel was dedicated to his profession, dedicated to his patients, and dedicated to practicing medicine at Sansum Clinic. He was active in the Wellness Program, worked with the Vascular Lab, continued to take hospital calls and periodically rotated in the Hospitalist service. Dr. Daniel served as the 'unofficial' Clinic Historian and he wrote a Noticias (Journal of the Santa Barbara Historical Museum), "Sansum Clinic - A Legacy of Innovation" with Erin T. Graffy. He also served many years as Medical Director at a Long Term Care facility.

Dr. Daniel was also known for his integrity. He believed strongly and passionately in the Hippocratic Oath. He believed all people were deserving of quality healthcare. He would spare no effort to make an accurate diagnosis. He knew well that medicine was an art as well as a science, and that warmth, sympathy and understanding were critical to patient care. He respected his patients' privacy. He believed deeply in the prevention of disease. He cared as passionately for those of sound mind and body as he did for the infirm.

These qualities were evident not only in his professional life with his many patients and colleagues, but were pillars of his personal friendships, his marriage and his parenting. Dr. Daniel was a true family man and **compassion, dedication, and integrity** extended far beyond his professional craft. He was thoughtful and honest and created an environment where even the smallest achievements were celebrated and the hard times taught a positive lesson. Dr. Daniel was always there to lend a helping hand, and was unwavering in his commitment to family and friends.

A beloved husband and loving father and grandfather, Dr. Erno Daniel was at once a physician and a friend – exemplified through his **compassion**, **dedication**, **and integrity**. He would be exceptionally proud of those who are carrying out his legacy at Sansum Clinic today.

Meet Legacy Society Member Dr. James Barbabella

Dr. James Barbabella is a retired physician who spent 28 years as an internist at Sansum Clinic. He and his wife, Maggie, were married in 1970 in Salem, Virginia. "I married up," Dr. Barbabella said cheerfully. The couple came to Santa Barbara in 1972. "I always told her how smart she was, even though she married me!"

Jim grew up in Florida and although she was born in Santa Barbara, Maggie's family moved away when she was nine years old. "I think she always wanted to return here," Jim said. When they met, Jim was in medical school and Maggie was working as a flight attendant for Pan American Airways in Florida. The two of them shared many things, with both having rollicking senses of humor.


"I finished medical school at the University of Miami and a year of internship at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, plus a year of residency at the VA Hospital in Salem/Roanoke, Virginia. I also went into private practice there for two years. I then came to Santa Barbara and worked at St. Francis Hospital in the emergency room. We rented a little place down by the beach, so Maggie was stuck in the fog all day, while I was at the hospital on the hillside where there was lots of sunshine. I wanted to buy a place where Maggie could also be in the sun. I found the perfect house in Montecito. It turned out to be across the street from Dr. Ed McGinn, who was a rheumatologist at Sansum Clinic. I was working very long and unpredictable hours, and when Ed suggested I come over to Sansum Clinic, I was excited because it was (and is) the Mayo Clinic of the West."

To join Sansum, Jim needed to be board certified in Internal Medicine. He and Maggie decided to move east to complete his residency at the University of Virginia-affiliated VA Hospital in Charlottesville, Virginia. While they were in Virginia, Dr. McGinn called to say that Cottage Hospital had started a new training program that would allow Jim to return to Santa Barbara. Jim applied and was approved for a third year of residency at Cottage Hospital. "In order to set up the new teaching program, I became the chief resident, which was funny, because I was their only resident at the time! It was my job to ask my former colleagues to be attending physicians for the program. So, I set it up and it was a big success," he said. "And that was the beginning of the teaching program at Cottage Hospital."

By the time Jim completed his residency at Cottage, there were no openings at Sansum Clinic. With a loan from the bank, he set up shop and was in business! With his practice in Santa Barbara, Jim found himself treating a lot of out-of-towners. About 60% of his patients came from the Central Valley. It was the 1970s and six months after opening his office, the gas crisis hit, which greatly reduced people's ability to travel to Santa Barbara.

Fortunately, there was an opening at Sansum Clinic at the time so Jim moved his practice to the Pueblo office. Later on, he opened Sansum's first clinic in Carpinteria.

"I loved working with my patients," said
Jim. "To connect with them, I often used
humor to help them relate to me and
relax. People came to Sansum from all
over the country. All of my patients were
special. I had the pleasure of providing
medical care to some well-known
celebrities. We treated everyone the same
and whether or not they were celebrities
had no bearing on their medical care."



One of Jim's patients worked in Las Vegas. He invited him for an all-expense-paid visit, which Jim declined. The invitation included tickets for a Lynda Carter concert. Lynda played Wonder Woman on TV. One day a package arrived at his office with a signed photo of Wonder Woman that read 'To Dr. Barbabella with All My Love, Lynda.' He jokingly told everyone they used to date, which they never did. He has that photo in his den to this day.

"The love of my life was my dear wife, Maggie. Sadly, she died 10 years ago," Jim said. "It was devastating to lose her." However, since then, he's found love again with Fran, who'd been Maggie's best friend and had lost her husband the year before Maggie died. A year after Maggie passed away, Jim decided to retire. "It was the right time for me to 'hang up my stethoscope," he said. "However, I miss my colleagues, the wonderful work we did at the Clinic and my many patients who gave my life purpose for so many years. I've included Sansum Clinic in my estate plan, because Sansum was very good to me and I'm grateful for that. It may sound trite, by remembering Sansum, I'm 'giving back' and that's important to me."




